**PROPERTY OF THE CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY PATROL (CHP)**

The original valid license must be kept at the licensee's place of business as indicated on the license and a legible copy must be carried in any vehicle or combination transporting hazardous materials and must be presented to any CHP officer upon request. This license is NON-TRANSFERABLE and must be surrendered to the CHP upon demand or as required by law. A majority change in ownership or control of the licensee activity shall require a new license. This license may be renewed by submitting an application and appropriate fee to the CHP. Persons whose licenses have expired or are otherwise no longer valid must immediately cease the activity requiring a license. THERE IS NO GRACE PERIOD. For licensing information contact CHP, Commercial Vehicle Section at (916) 843-3400.

This carrier is on the special routing/safe stopping place mailing lists as indicated below.

- (HM) Explosives subject to Division 14, California Vehicle Code (CVC).
- (HMPH) Poison Inhalation Hazard materials in bulk packages subject to Division 14.3, CVC.
- (HMRCQ) Highway Route Controlled Quantity radioactive materials subject to Division 14.5, CVC.

Any person who dumps, spills, or causes the release of hazardous materials or hazardous waste upon any highway shall immediately notify the CHP or the agency having jurisdiction for that highway. The minimum fine for failure to make the appropriate notification is \$2,000.00. (CVC Section 23112.5)
